OUTLOOK: Possible topics for future meetings (collected from interviews)

- Economic assessments – understanding the costs and benefits of long-term climate policy
- Relationship between 2050 long-term strategies and 2030 National Energy and Climate Plans
- Stakeholder engagement for long-term planning / communicating 2050 to the public
- Going carbon “neutral”: balancing emissions and sinks – options for “negative emissions”
- Governance of long-term strategies: procedures for implementation, monitoring and review
- Intra-governmental coordination –pitfalls and opportunities of engaging different Ministries
- Translating between modelling and policy-making: how and where to raise mutual understanding
- Sector specific targets and strategies in long-term strategies: exchange of experience
