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# Legal document's preparation and consultation process in Lithuania- usual practice



Identification of main authorities and stakeholders.  
Formulate working group – government authorities (WG).

Preparation of draft document (Top down approach)

Consulting with the WG (meeting and following by written consultations)

Feedback from WG and updating the document

Final draft circulated for public consultations (e-platform, written consultations)

Preparing final document according to the feedback received

*The final decision highly depends on political will and finances*


# Stakeholders engagement in climate change policy making and monitoring process



## The National Climate Change Committee

- It consists of experts from government, academia and non-governmental organizations (NGOs) and has an advisory role.
- The main objective of the Committee is to ensure attainment of the GHG emissions goals and implementation of the measures for attaining such goals.
- Committee **provide recommendations** for newly prepared National Climate Change Management Policy **Strategies** and its implementation plans, other strategic documents and programs, national legislative projects related to climate change management and implementation issues.
- Committee **deliger insights on Lithuanian positions** regarding EU legal acts related with climate change management.
- Committee **submits proposals regarding the annual priorities for the financing of climate change** management measures under the Special Program for Climate Change.
- The decisions of the Committee are advisory and recommendation nature.
